Subject: Revised CalPeco Tariff Reflecting Updated Income Eligibility Levels for the California Alternate Rate for Energy Program and the Energy Savings Assistance Program

Pursuant to Resolution E-3524, the purpose of this letter is for California Pacific Electric Company, LLC (U 933-E)) ("CalPeco")¹ to request California Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") approval to revise its tariffs to update the income eligibility for the California Alternate Rate for Energy ("CARE") Program and the Energy Savings Assistance Program ("ESAP").

Background

In a Notice to Investor Owned Utilities ("IOUs") dated April 27, 2011, Ms. Fitch requested that energy utilities file revised tariffs reflecting the new income levels.

Proposed Changes

CalPeco seeks to implement the new Federal Poverty Guideline levels. All tariffs, internet sites and printed materials about CARE and ESAP will display the revised income eligibility guidelines and their effective dates, up through a household of six.

Protests

Anyone wishing to protest this filing may do so by letter sent via U.S. mail, by facsimile or by email, any of which must be received no later than **July 27, 2011**, which is 20 days after the date of this filing. The protest shall set forth the grounds upon which it is based and shall be submitted expeditiously. There is no restriction on who may file a protest. Protests should be mailed to:

SPECIAL CONDITIONS (Continued)

- 2. Baseline Quantities. (Continued)
 - (3)Life support devices means those devices which utilize mechanical or artificial means to sustain, restore, or supplant a vital function, or mechanical equipment which is relied upon for mobility both within and outside building. Life support devices or equipment include those listed in PUC Section 739.2.
 - D. Limitation. Space heating quantities shall be available only where a minimum of 80% of available living area is heated by permanently installed electric space heating equipment. Partial quantities will not be offered.
- 3. CARE Program. The California Alternate Rates for Energy ("CARE") is a program of assistance to low-income electric customers. The assistance is in the form of discounted rates that are listed above.
 - A. Eligibility for CARE. A household eligible for CARE is one in which the total annual gross income from all sources is not more than what is shown on the following table that is based on the number of persons living in the household. For the period of June 1, 2011 to May 31, 2012 the combined income of all persons from all sources, both taxable and non-taxable, shall be no more than:

Number of Persons Living in

<u>Household</u>	Total Annual Gross Income
1 or 2	\$31,800
3	37,400
4	45,100
5	52,800
6	60,500

For households with more than six persons, add \$7,700 for each additional person. A person who is claimed as a dependent on another person's income tax return is not eligible for service under this rate schedule. Pursuant to CPUC 739.4, the above annual gross income levels are subject to revision subsequent to the Commission's establishment of new rates on or before May 1 of each year.

B. Application and Eligibility Declaration. An application and eligibility declaration on a form authorized by the Commission is required for each request for service under this rate schedule. Renewal of a Customer's eligibility declaration will be required on an annual basis.
