Subject: Greenhouse Gas Cost Recovery and Revenue Allocation

Pursuant to a request by Energy Division, Liberty Utilities (CalPeco Electric) LLC (U 933-E) ("Liberty Utilities") hereby submits this first Supplement ("Supplement") to Advice Letter 33-E. As directed by Energy Division, this Supplement corrects errors made to the residential climate credit.

Accordingly, the enclosed Attachment A includes a revised tariff to reflect a credit amount of \$41.60 based on the correct amortization of 2013 allowance revenues over a 24-month period.

#### **Effective Date**

The Energy Division Director Letter announcing the schedule to introduce GHG costs and revenues in rates provides that the tariff modifications should be effective as of April 1, 2014. Thus, Liberty Utilities requests that its **Tier 1** Advice Letter as revised by this Supplement be effective as of April 1, 2014.

#### **Proposed Tariff Modifications**

Beginning on April 1, 2014 Liberty Utilities will issue a California Climate Credit in compliance with Decision 13-12-041. There are three customer sub-classes that are eligible for the credit.

#### a. Emission-Intense and Trade-Exposed (EITE) Customers

Customers in this sub-class meet the California Air Resource Board's leakage risk Industry Assistance definition as adopted in ARB's Cap-and-Trade program. The credit amount will be calculated pursuant to Decision 12-12-033.

#### b. Small Business Customers

#### (1) Continued

The cost and revenue balances accumulated in the GHG cost sub-account and the GHG Revenue Balancing Account will be amortized so that all deferred costs are recovered and all deferred revenues are distributed within 24 months.

#### (2) Carbon Pollution Permit Cost

Beginning on April 1, 2014 Liberty Utilities will include on all customer bills a charge to reimburse Liberty Utilities' for costs incurred and estimated to incur in compliance with Decision 13-12-041. This cost is applicable to all customer classes. It is based on monthly kilowatt usage and will be at a rate of \$0.00770 per killowat hour.

This cost will be updated on an annual basis.

#### (3) California (CA) Climate Credit

Beginning on April 1, 2014 Liberty Utilities will issue a California Climate Credit in compliance with Decision 13-12-041. There are three customer sub-classes that are eligible for the credit.

#### a. Emission-Intense and Trade-Exposed (EITE) Customers

Customers in this sub-class meet the California Air Resource Board's leakage risk Industry Assistance definition as adopted in ARB's Cap-and-Trade program. The credit amount will be calculated pursuant to Decision 12-12-033.

#### b. Small Business Customers

Small business is defined as non-residential entities on a General Service or Agricultural tariffs whose electric demand does not exceed 20 killowatts in more than three months of the preceding twelve month period. Eligibility will be determined during Liberty Utilities' annual rate migration process and remain in effect until the next migration process.

The credit will be calculated as the (Carbon Pollution Permit Cost x monthly usage x the Industry Assistance factor). The Industry Assistance factors are located in Appendix 2, Table 1 of Decision 13-12-041.

Subject: Greenhouse Gas Cost Recovery and Revenue Allocation

Liberty Utilities (CalPeco Electric) LLC (U 933-E) ("Liberty Utilities") hereby submits this **Tier 1** Advice Letter to make tariff changes necessary to introduce greenhouse gas ("GHG") costs and revenues in rates effective on April 1, 2014 pursuant to Decision ("D") 13-12-041 and the Energy Division Letter of January 28, 2014 ("Energy Division Director Letter") announcing the schedule to introduce GHG costs and revenues in rates.

#### **Background**

The Energy Division Director Letter provides the appropriate background for this advice letter:

The [California Public Utilities] Commission's [("Commission")] 2012 decision adopting a GHG allowance revenue allocation methodology . . . established rules about how the electric utilities should distribute GHG allowance revenue to residential, small business and emissions-intensive and trade-exposed entities (EITEs). In this same decision, the Commission acknowledged that many implementation details had yet to be finalized and that GHG costs should not be included in rates until necessary implementation details have been resolved. The utilities were ordered to defer recovery of these costs from rates until the Director of the Energy Division issues a letter declaring that the GHG revenue allocation methodology is ready for implementation.

Since 2012 the Commission has adopted D.13-12-002, which approved the formula utilities will use to distribute revenue to small businesses, and it adopted D.13-12-003, which approved utility implementation plans that addressed a number of details

about how both GHG costs and allowance revenues will be returned to different customers. D.13-12-003 concluded that the semi-annual residential credit should occur in April and October of each year, beginning in 2014, but it reiterated that the Energy Division Director "shall make the final determination... when GHG cost and revenue distribution begins..." This decision also clarified that the introduction of GHG costs in rates and the return of revenues to residential and small business customers need not await the final resolution of formulas to allocate revenues to EITE customers.

As required by D.12-12-033, the five electric utilities... each filed an application on August 1, 2013, to forecast GHG costs that will be incurred and revenues that will be received in 2014. These consolidated applications (A.13-08-002, et al) were approved in D.13-12-041. This decision authorized the utilities to recover forecasted GHG costs in rates, and it defined how the utilities should amortize deferred costs. It also approved specific dollar amounts to be returned to households via a semi-annual climate credit. This decision again reiterated that GHG cost recovery and revenue allocation would not begin until the Energy Division Director issues a letter. D.13-12-041 further clarified that this letter should include timing requirements for the utilities to submit Tier 1 Advice Letters with tariff sheet modifications necessary to introduce GHG costs and revenues as the Commission has directed.<sup>1</sup>

Accordingly, Liberty Utilities files this Tier 1 Advice Letter with the tariff sheet modifications necessary to introduce GHG costs and revenues as the Commission has directed.

In addition, in D. 13-12-041, the Commission ordered Liberty Utilities to file proof of compliance with Rule 3.2 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure with its Tier 1 Advice Letter.<sup>2</sup>

#### **Tariff Modifications**

Liberty Utilities submits the following tariff modifications (attached as Exhibit A) necessary to introduce GHG costs and revenues as the Commission has directed:

Liberty Utilities is adding language to the existing Sheet 54, Greenhouse Gas Revenue Balancing Account, to address (i) the recovery of Carbon Pollution Permit Costs and (ii) the issuance of carbon auction proceeds in the form of the California (CA) Climate credit. This additional language is noted on Sheets 54A and 54B.

D.13-12-041 directed Liberty Utilities to revise the amounts and calculations in Exhibit LU-1C Exhibit 2, 2013 and 2014 Greenhouse Gas Cost Summary, to amortize 2013 greenhouse gas (GHG) costs and allowance revenues over a 24-month period. In a subsequent review of the revised amounts and calculations, Liberty Utilities concluded that it had appropriately amortized 2013 GHG costs over the 24-month period, but that the 2013 allowance revenues were incorrectly amortized over the original 12-month period.

The erroneous semi-annual climate credit of \$55.41 is \$13.81 greater than if the 2013 allowance revenues had been correctly amortized. This calculation error will be remedied in Liberty Utilities' GHG Revenue and Reconciliation Application due on August 1, 2014.

#### **Rule 3.2 Compliance**

Exhibit B certifies that Liberty Utilities mailed the notice included in Exhibit C to the applicable state, county, and municipal governmental agencies and has included the notice as a bill insert to all customers as required by Rule 3.2 (b) and Rule 3.2(d). Exhibit B also certifies that Liberty Utilities caused a notice, in general terms, of the proposed increases in rates to be published in newspapers of general circulation in the counties in which the increases are proposed to be made effective on the dates noted in the attachment as required by Rule 3.2(c). Exhibit D provides Liberty Utilities' proof of publication in those newspapers of general circulation described in Exhibit B

#### **Effective Date**

The Energy Division Director Letter announcing the schedule to introduce GHG costs and revenues in rates provides that the tariff modifications should be effective as of April 1, 2014. Thus, Liberty Utilities requests that this **Tier 1** Advice Letter be effective as of April 1, 2014.

#### **Protests**

#### **NEW CARBON POLLUTION CHARGE AND CREDIT EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2014**

Since last summer, we've been providing information about the California Legislature's Global Warming Solutions Act (Assembly Bill 32), designed to reduce the state's carbon footprint to 1990 levels. Fossil-fueled power plants are one of the biggest sources of carbon pollution in the state and are subject to regulations intended to reduce their emissions. The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) is tasked with managing how the costs of these regulations affect customers of investor-owned utilities like Liberty Utilities.

All eligible residential customers will receive an on-bill credit known as a "climate credit" (the name of the charge may change pending CPUC review) on their April 2014 and October 2014 statements. This credit will be approximately \$55 for each of those months.

#### **New Small Business Credit:**

Eligible small businesses (rate class A1) will receive an on-bill credit known as a climate credit (the name of the charge may change pending CPUC review) on their monthly statements beginning April 2014. The credit amount will be equal to the associated GHG monthly charge.

All residential customers are eligible for the climate credit if they were a customer of Liberty Utilities one month prior to the credit being issued, and are currently an active customer.
