**Subject: Notice of Proposed Construction Project Pursuant to General Order 131-D
for Improvements to the 14.4 kV 7203 Distribution Line**

Liberty Utilities (CalPeco Electric) LLC (U 933-E) (“Liberty Utilities”) hereby submits notice pursuant to the California Public Utilities Commission’s (“CPUC”) General Order (“G.O.”) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment A) and the Notice of Distribution List (Attachment B), which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI. In addition, Liberty Utilities is sending a copy of this advice letter to the service list for Application (“A.”) 10-08-024.

Background

Liberty Utilities is proposing to reconnector a 1.1 mile section of its 14.4 kilovolt (“kV”) 7203 distribution line (“7203 Distribution Line”). The 7203 Distribution Line is located entirely within the Town of Truckee, California. It lies outside of the jurisdiction of the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency (“TRPA”).

The northern portion of the 7203 Distribution Line runs between NV Energy’s Truckee Substation (located near the intersection of Glenshire Drive and Donner Pass Road) and the Truckee Donner Public Utility District’s (“TDPUD”) Martis Substation (located between the Truckee River and Estates Drive). The northern portion of the 7203 Distribution Line is underbuilt on the 120 kV 132 power line, which is owned and operated by NV Energy.

The southern portion of the 7203 Distribution Line runs between the Martis Substation and Liberty Utilities’ Northstar Substation (located at the intersection of Stables Road and Northstar Drive). The southern portion of the 7203 Distribution Line is underbuilt on Liberty Utilities’ 60 kV 650 power line.

The subject of this advice letter is a 1.1 mile segment that spans between the northern and southern portions of the 7203 Distribution Line from the first 132/650 line double circuit structure located outside of NV Energy's Truckee Substation to Brockway Road (the "7203 Distribution Line Project"). Liberty Utilities needs to replace the distribution wire on this portion of the 7203 Distribution Line with larger-diameter distribution wire (i.e., reconductor the line) to maintain adequate distribution line capacity necessary for the safe and reliable delivery of electric service to Liberty Utilities' customers. Specifically, the 7203 Distribution Line Project will allow Liberty Utilities to support approximately five megawatts of additional load on the 7203 Distribution Line, which will help Liberty Utilities meet anticipated peak energy demand during the winter of 2014/15. This Project will not change the voltage on any portion of the 7203 Distribution Line, and it will not reduce the need for Liberty Utilities' proposed overall project to upgrade its existing 625 and 650 Lines (pending A. 10-08-024) ("625/650 Line Upgrade Project").

Changing out the existing distribution wire to a larger wire on this portion of the 7203 Distribution Line will increase the amount of weight and wind loads that the power poles must support. These power poles hold not only the 7203 Distribution Line, but also Liberty Utilities' 60 kV 650 line and NV Energy's 120 kV 132 line (each for certain portions, as described above). In order to support the new distribution wire and satisfy applicable safety and reliability standards, Liberty Utilities has determined that it must replace 23 wood power poles on the 7203 Distribution Line as part of the 7203 Distribution Line Project.

Liberty Utilities is planning to replace the existing wood poles with self-weathering dark brown steel poles because: (i) steel poles are stronger, more resistant to wildfires and other fires, and more aesthetically pleasing because they do not require guy wires and will reduce clutter in the right of way; and (ii) Liberty Utilities is proposing to replace these wood poles with steel poles as part of its 625/650 Line Upgrade Project. Given that Liberty Utilities is proposing to replace these same wood poles with steel poles as part of the 625/650 Line Upgrade Project, the most cost effective approach is for Liberty Utilities to replace these wood poles with steel poles at this time as part of the 7203 Distribution Line Project (as opposed to replacing them with new, stronger wood poles which Liberty Utilities is proposing to replace shortly thereafter with steel poles).

The existing wood poles are approximately 70 feet in height and 18.2 inches in diameter at ground height. The new steel poles will be approximately the same height (an average of 75 feet above the ground) and diameter (an average of 25 inches at ground height) as the existing wood poles. Nineteen of the replacement steel poles will not require any new access and will be placed in approximately the same locations as the existing wood poles. The exceptions are four poles that will be moved slightly in coordination with the Town of Truckee in order to accommodate the Town of Truckee's plan to widen and install a bike lane on Glenshire Drive in the summer of 2014. All 23 replaced poles will continue to be located entirely on private parcels and within the existing easements. Liberty Utilities intends to commence construction in approximately August 2014, with the objective that the new facilities be operational as of September 2014.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. Specifically, Subsections 1(b), (c), (e) and (g), respectively, state that a utility need not obtain a Permit to Construct if its construction activities consist of "the replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures;" "the minor relocation of existing power line facilities up to 2,000 feet in length;" "the placing of new or additional conductors, insulators, or their accessories on supporting structures already built;" or the construction of "power line facilities... to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement."

The CPUC requires utilities to employ "no cost" and "low cost" measures to reduce public exposure to electric and magnetic fields ("EMF"). In accordance with this requirement, Liberty Utilities will maintain the existing right of way ("ROW") width of 40 feet along the length of the 7203 Distribution Line that will be improved as part of the 7203 Distribution Line Project, which is already well above the standard ROW for 14.4kV distribution lines and will reduce public exposure to EMF by providing additional distance between the 7203 Distribution Line and the public.

No cost information is required for this advice letter.

This advice letter will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

Protests

Anyone wishing to protest this advice letter may do so by letter sent via U.S. mail, by facsimile or electronically, any of which must be received no later than June 4, 2014, which is 20 days after the date of this advice letter. Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that Liberty Utilities has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in Section III, Subsection B.2 of G.O. 131-D exist. There are no restrictions on who may file a protest, but the protest shall set forth specifically the grounds upon which it is based and shall be submitted expeditiously.

Proposed Project: Liberty Utilities is proposing to reconnector a 1.1 mile section of its 14.4 kilovolt (“kV”) 7203 distribution line (“7203 Distribution Line”). The 7203 Distribution Line is located entirely within the Town of Truckee, California. It lies outside of the jurisdiction of the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency (“TRPA”).

The northern portion of the 7203 Distribution Line runs between NV Energy’s Truckee Substation (located near the intersection of Glenshire Drive and Donner Pass Road) and the Truckee Donner Public Utility District’s (“TDPUD”) Martis Substation (located between the Truckee River and Estates Drive). The northern portion of the 7203 Distribution Line is underbuilt on the 120 kV 132 power line, which is owned and operated by NV Energy.

Exemption from CPUC Permit Process: CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. Specifically, Subsections 1(b), (c), (e) and (g), respectively, state that a utility need not obtain a Permit to Construct if its construction activities consist of "the replacement of existing power line facilities or supporting structures with equivalent facilities or structures;" "the minor relocation of existing power line facilities up to 2,000 feet in length;" "the placing of new or additional conductors, insulators, or their accessories on supporting structures already built;" or the construction of "power line facilities... to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement."

EMF Compliance: The CPUC requires utilities to employ "no cost" and "low cost" measures to reduce public exposure to electric and magnetic fields ("EMF"). In accordance with this requirement, Liberty Utilities will maintain the existing right of way ("ROW") width of 40 feet along the length of the 7203 Distribution Line that will be improved as part of the 7203 Distribution Line Project, which is already well above the standard ROW for 14.4kV distribution lines and will reduce public exposure to EMF by providing additional distance between the 7203 Distribution Line and the public.

Public Review Process: Persons or groups may protest the proposed construction if they believe that Liberty Utilities has incorrectly applied for an exemption or that the conditions set out in Section III, Subsection B.2 of G.O. 131-D exist. There are no restrictions on who may file a protest, but the protest shall set forth specifically the grounds upon which it is based and shall be submitted expeditiously.

Protests should include the following:

1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
