Subject: Liberty CalPeco's Plan to Calculate EVSE Base Costs for the DCFC Program

#### I. Purpose

Liberty Utilities (CalPeco Electric) LLC (U 933 E) ("Liberty CalPeco") hereby submits this Tier 2 Advice Letter No. 114-E with its plan to conduct a request for proposal and calculate Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment ("EVSE") base costs for the DC Fast Charger ("DCFC") program to calculate the rebate and participation amounts.

#### II. Background

Per CPUC direction, "Prior to implementation, Liberty Utilities (CalPeco Electric) LLC (hereinafter, Liberty) must file a Tier 2 Advice Letter reflecting the authorized budget in Table 4, Section 7. The Tier 2 Advice Letter should also include Liberty's plans to conduct a request for proposal and calculate EVSE base costs for the DCFC program from which to calculate the rebate and participation payment amounts." Liberty CalPeco has also included an updated table to reflect categorization changes of approved funding from capital expenditures to expenses.

#### III. <u>Liberty CalPeco's Implementation Plan</u>

- 1. Liberty CalPeco will issue a Request for Quotations (RFQ) for EVSE in which responders will be asked to provide price quotations by power output tier, following prescriptive requirements for qualifying equipment.
- 2. Because some site hosts may want to install higher capacity chargers, Liberty CalPeco will solicit pricing on three different power tiers (*i.e.*, 50 kW, 100 kW and 150 kW). This is needed to avoid skewing the market by driving all participants to the lowest capacity just to meet program requirements. The intent is to support the direction of the private charging market and to avoid creating an artificial market.

- 3. To avoid outlier low bids that create inadequate rebates, which in turn hobble the program, Liberty CalPeco will use an average cost from the quotations received for each power tier to determine rebate and participation amounts. The intent is to provide value to ratepayers by helping ensure that quality, durable equipment is placed into service, and that rebate amounts are sufficient to foster program participation by third-party site hosts.
- 4. As prescribed in the final decision, Liberty CalPeco will provide rebate or participation payments of 50% of the EVSE base costs, as determined via the procedures described above.
