Subject: ESA Pilot Implementation Plan

I. PURPOSE

Pursuant to Commission Decision (D.) 18-08-020, Liberty Utilities (CalPeco Electric) LLC (U 933 E) ("Liberty CalPeco") hereby submits a Pilot Implementation Plan to implement multifamily common measures.

II. BACKGROUND

In Ordering Paragraph 32 of Decision (D.) 18-08-020, Liberty CalPeco was authorized to implement a multi-family common area measures program as part of its Energy Savings Assistance ("ESA") program. D.18-08-020 also directed Liberty CalPeco to submit a Pilot Implementation Plan for the pilot program via a Tier 2 Advice Letter. The plan was authorized on a pilot basis.

III. PILOT IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

A. Pilot Description

The purpose of Liberty CalPeco's Energy Savings Assistance Multi-Family Common Area Measures Pilot Program ("ESA Pilot") is to deploy energy savings measures in common areas of apartment buildings that primarily serve low-income residents. This program is designed as a supplement to Liberty CalPeco's ESA program, which provides energy efficiency ("EE") measures for individual units, but not common areas of multi-family dwellings.

B. Pilot Rationale and Expected Outcomes

The multi-family affordable housing units in the Liberty CalPeco service territory that have been evaluated for treatments under this pilot program present many opportunities for energy efficiency upgrades. The installation of EE measures in these multi-family residences will provide more livable and comfortable common spaces for all residents, reduce overall energy use, and potentially help keep rents affordable by lowering the cost of operations for property owners. In addition, treatments in common areas provide an educational opportunity for all residents, whether or not they have participated in the ESA program.

The ESA Pilot serves a need not currently being filled by Liberty CalPeco's other energy efficiency programs, which focus on residential, commercial, and school treatments, but have to this point not focused on multi-family common areas. By utilizing contractors that have experience in energy efficiency upgrades, with oversight by Liberty CalPeco, the program will be delivered in a competent and cost-effective manner.

Liberty CalPeco intends to implement the ESA Pilot at all eligible multi-family properties in its service territory willing to participate. These properties include ten locations identified by the Solar on Multi-family Affordable Housing ("SOMAH") Program, as shown in Appendix 1, Table 1. Liberty CalPeco plans on coordinating with its ESA program administrator, Richard Heath & Associates, Inc. ("RHA"), to schedule EE treatments of qualified residential units and common area portions of multi-family properties during the same time frame to maximize efficient ESA and ESA Pilot program delivery.

C. Evaluation, Measurement and Verification (EM&V) Plan

Liberty CalPeco will contract with RHA to deploy contractors to inspect, evaluate and measure results of completed common area treatments. The anticipated results of the ESA Pilot include:

- Common area measures ("CAM") installed at five or more multi-family affordable housing properties that include all appropriate measures approved in ESAP.
- Total energy savings MWh per year at each location to be estimated pending initial building assessments

D. Implementation Criteria

As stated in the ESA Policy and Procedures manual, qualifying multi-family buildings in Liberty CalPeco's service territory will meet the following criteria:

• Multi-family buildings are defined as "those with five or more attached units"

- Eligible buildings "must be dedicated to providing affordable housing to low-income Californians in deed restricted, government and non-profit owned multifamily buildings"
- At least 65% of all occupied units in that multifamily building must be occupied by low income households eligible for the ESA Program
- Eligible measures which can be implemented found in Table 5-1 of the Policy and Procedures manual, pp. 31-33

E. Schedule

Liberty CalPeco's ESA Pilot program is scheduled to continue through ESA program year 2020. The ESA Pilot was not implemented in 2018. The 2019 timeline is described below.

• September-October, 2019:

- Conduct outreach to all identified eligible multi-family properties to enlist participation in the Liberty CalPeco ESA Pilot
- o Coordinate outreach with Liberty CalPeco's promotion of the ESA program to tenants of these multi-family properties.
- Work with RHA and installation contractors to schedule treatments of eligible and willing residential units with common areas

• October, 2019:

- Contract with RHA for delivery (via subcontractor) of energy efficiency common area energy efficiency assessments and treatments
- o Gain agreement with proper owners on measures to be implemented

• November – December, 2019:

- Contractors deploy first round of common area treatments at participating multifamily residences
- Continue outreach efforts to identify eligible properties for participation in 2020 program year

• January, 2020:

- Report on pilot program prepared for submission in Liberty CalPeco's Low Income Assistance Programs 2020 Annual Report
- o Previous year unspent funds rolled over into 2020 program year

F. Budget

The ESA Pilot budget for 2019, shown in Appendix 1, Table 2, includes estimated expenditures for marketing, evaluation, outreach and other administrative costs, collectively categorized as Administrative. Measure installations include all contractor labor and materials. The authorized

ESA and ESA Pilot budgets by program year per D.18-08-020 are illustrated in Appendix 1, Table 3.

IV. TIER DESIGNATION

Pursuant to General Order 96-B, Section 5, this Advice Letter is being submitted with a Tier 2 designation.

V. EFFECTIVE DATE

Liberty CalPeco requests that this Tier 2 Advice Letter become effective October 10, 2019.

VI. PROTESTS

Anyone wishing to protest this Advice Letter may do so by letter sent via U.S. mail, facsimile or email, any of which must be received no later than October 30, 2019, which is 20 days after the date of this Advice Letter.
