Advice Letter No. 258-W

November 1, 2021

TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Liberty Utilities (Apple Valley Ranchos Water) Corp. (U 346-W) (“Liberty Apple Valley”) hereby transmits this advice letter to inform the California Public Utilities Commission (“Commission”) for filing revised copies of the following tariff schedules.

The purpose of this advice letter is to revise the service area map of Liberty Apple Valley.

Summary

The revised service area map includes a distinct area where property owners have requested water service from Liberty Apple Valley. The area of the proposed expansion is identified as Belco Development and Investments, Major Family Trust, VT Holdings, Royce and Edythe Avery, Robert and Olga Habersham Trust, and Patricia Nickell. The service area is contiguous to Liberty Apple Valley’s existing service area and are not currently provided water service by any other utility. There are no adjacent water utilities to provide water service to these property owners. Liberty Apple Valley can provide service to these property owners without adversely affecting service to its existing customers.

The area of the proposed expansion, Belco Development and Investments and the other additional property owners requested annexation is located at the northwest corner of Dale Evans Parkway and Willow Springs Road. The properties are parcel numbers APN# 0472-232-04, 06, 08, 09, 10, 11, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 19, 20, 21, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, and 32; APN# 0472-242-01, and 02; APN# 0472-272-02, 18, 19, and 20; and APN# 0472-273-05, 10, 11, 14, 15, and 16. This area is for commercial development. A Water Supply and Certification Questionnaire (“WSCQ”) for the development is contained in section WSCQ-1 of the attached workpapers. The total number of lots used in the WSCQ is 39.

The owners are aware of their financial responsibilities in seeking water service. New facilities required to provide service in this area will be financed in accordance with the provisions of the Commission’s Rule No. 15.

The San Bernardino County Fire Department does not oppose the proposed service area expansion. A letter acknowledging the service area expansion is contained in the attached workpapers.

Background

The primary source of water supply to serve the proposed service area expansion will be groundwater from the Alto Subarea of the Mojave Water Basin. The Mojave Water Basin is an adjudicated groundwater basin (*City of Barstow v. City of Adelanto*, Case No. 208568 Riverside Superior Court) and is supported by the physical solution in that case administered by the Court

appointed Watermaster, the Mojave Water Agency (“MWA”). According to the MWA 2020 Urban Water Management Plan Update (“2020 Plan”), MWA has extended the planning horizon considered in its 2020 Plan from the statutorily required twenty-year timeline to a much longer forty-five-year period through 2065. This extended planning horizon allows MWA and the regional retail water purveyors to address longer-term land use planning, water planning, and infrastructure considerations.¹

Ultimately, the availability of water supplies for Liberty Apple Valley to meet the demand associated with the proposed service area expansion is dependent upon MWA’s ability to manage the basin and to implement additional water projects and management actions necessary to continue to recharge the groundwater basin, maintain groundwater levels, and protect groundwater quality. MWA’s 2020 Plan concludes, “MWA has sufficient available regional supplies to meet the regional demands through 2065”.² However, the owners are aware that in the event that mandatory conservation and/or limitations are necessary, the proposed project would adhere to any and all limitations associated with potential reductions in supply.

Tier Designation

According to Water Industry Rule 7.3 of General Order 96-B, this service area expansion advice letter is classified as Tier 2.

Requested Effective Date

Pursuant to Water Industry Rule 8.1 of General Order 96-B, Liberty Apple Valley requests this filing become effective 30 days from its filing date.

Notice and Service

Pursuant to Water Industry Rule 4.1 and General Rules 4.3 and 7.2 of General Order 96-B, a copy of this Advice Letter will be mailed or electronically transmitted on November 1, 2021 to competing and adjacent utilities and other utilities or interested parties having requested such notification.

A copy of this advice letter has also been transmitted to the Local Agency Formation Commission.

Response or Protest

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order or is not authorized by statute or Commission order upon which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding;
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Division of Water within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. 
