
SNOWFEST PARADES A WINTER BLAST!

LIBERTY GOES GREEN

Just like you, Liberty wants to take care of the beautiful environment we work and live in, so we are committed to reducing our carbon footprint. Over the years, our energy efficient programs have helped hundreds of customers reduce their energy use and save money (go to www.libertyutilities.com/west and click on the "Save Energy & Money" link at the bottom). But there's two new exciting programs helping us "go green":

Electric Vehicles (EV)

Vehicle emissions are the greatest contributor to air pollution. Liberty recently purchased a Toyota RAV 4 electric vehicle (EV) to add to its utility fleet. Of Liberty's total fleet, about 21% are either hybrids or alternative fuel vehicles. We've also installed an EV charging station at each of our office locations, helping users extend their car's charge. Expanded use of EVs can actually lower utility rates because nighttime charging, if done off-peak, can ultimately benefit all utility customers. The Tahoe Regional Planning Agency recently received a \$200,000 federal grant to identify possible EV charging station locations around the lake, and Liberty is a partner in that effort.

Solar Generation

Earlier this year, Liberty-CA issued it's first-ever Request for Proposal (RFP) for the development of a utility-scale solar photovoltaic (PV) project. The project would provide 20 to 60 MW of power. We received a lot of interest, and hope to award the bid soon with construction starting in early 2016. Liberty's power mix is currently 21.7% renewables and meets California's legislative mandates. In the future, our own solar generation facility will help us meet this ever-increasing mandate.

Improved Electrical Lines

While not a new program, planned upgrades to two major power lines (known as the 625 & 650 Electrical Lines) will help reduce Liberty's dependence on its emergency diesel generators to meet peak demand. This past winter, we had to use just over 36,000 gallons of diesel fuel to keep the lights on between December 25, 2014 and January 3, 2015, even with calls for conservation among our customers. Upgrades to this aging infrastructure, including the area's substations, will improve service reliability by allowing greater load transfer and switching during times of distress. The project has received nearly all required approvals, and we anticipate initial construction on Phase 1 to start this summer.
