Subject: Liberty Utilities (CalPeco Electric) LLC (U-933 E) – Proposed Modifications to Rule 20 Pursuant to Decision 21-06-013

In compliance with Ordering Paragraph ("OP") 5 of California Public Utilities Commission ("CPUC") Decision ("D.") 21-06-013, Liberty Utilities (CalPeco Electric) LLC ("Liberty") hereby submits this Tier 1 advice letter to propose changes to its Rule 20 tariff.

#### **Purpose**

In compliance with OP 5 of D.21-06-013, Liberty submits this advice letter to propose changes to its Rule 20 tariff. The revised tariff sheets are attached.

#### **Background**

In OP 5 of D.21-06-013, the CPUC ordered the Utilities to:

[E]ach file a Tier 1 advice letter within 30 days of the effective date of this decision with its current Electric Rule 20 Tariff, including the following modifications to implement this decision: (a) clarify that unauthorized work credit trading is not permitted, except for intra-county donations of work credits from a county government to cities and towns within the county or from a city or town to its county government, and pooling of work credits amongst two or more adjoining municipalities for a project with community benefit for the adjoining municipalities, (b) clarify that the utility does not have the discretion to allow communities to borrow work credits from future allocations beyond any 2022 allocation, and (c) modify the project eligibility criteria in its Rule 20A Tariff to provide as follows: "(iii) Wheelchair access is limited or impeded in a manner that is not compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act; (iv) The street or road or right-of-way adjoins or passes through a civic area or public recreation area or an area of significant scenic, cultural, and/or historic interest to the general public; or (v) The street or road or right-of way is considered an arterial street or major collector as defined by the California Department of Transportation's California Road System functional classification system." Each electric utility shall serve this advice letter on the service list of this proceeding.

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These changes are reflected in the attached revised tariff sheets.

#### **Tier Designation**

Pursuant to OP 5 of D.21-06-013, this Advice Letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation.

#### **Effective Date**

Liberty requests that this Tier 1 advice filing become effective today, July 6, 2021.

#### **Protests**

Anyone wishing to protest this filing may do so by letter sent via U.S. mail, by facsimile or by email, any of which must be received no later than **July 26, 2021**, which is 20 days after the date of this filing. 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#### Rule No. 20

#### REPLACEMENT OF OVERHEAD WITH UNDERGROUND ELECTRIC FACILITIES

Α.	The Utility will, at its expense, replace its existing overhead electric facilities with
	underground electric facilities along public streets and roads, and on public lands and
	private property across which rights-of-way satisfactory to the Utility have been obtained
	by the Utility, provided that:

- 1. The governing body of the city or county in which such electric facilities are and will be located has:
  - a. Determined, after consultation with the Utility and after holding public hearings on the subject, that such undergrounding is in the general public interest for one or more of the following reasons:
    - (1) Such undergrounding will avoid or eliminate an unusually heavy concentration of overhead electric facilities.
    - (2) The street or road or right-of-way is extensively used by the general public and carries a heavy volume of pedestrian or vehicular traffic.
    - (3) The street or road or right-of-way adjoins or passes through a civic area or public recreation area or an area of unusual scenic, cultural and/or historic interest to the general public.
    - (4) The street or road or right-of-way is considered an arterial street or major collector as defined by the California Department of Transportation's California Road System functional classification system.
    - (5) Wheelchair access is limited or impeded in a manner that is not compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act;
  - b. Adopted an ordinance creating an underground district in the area in which both the existing and new facilities are and will be located requiring, among other things, (1) that all existing overhead communication and electric distribution facilities in such district shall be removed, (2) that each property served from such electric overhead facilities shall have installed in accordance with the Utility's rules for underground service, all electrical facility changes on the premises necessary to receive service from the underground facilities of the Utility as soon as it is available, and (3) authorizing the Utility to discontinue its overhead service.

<ul> <li>The undergrounding extends for a minimum distance of one block or 600 feet, whichever is the lesser.</li> <li>Upon request of the governing body, the Utility will pay from the exisiting allocation of that entity for: <ul> <li>a. The installation of no more than 100 feet of each customer's underground electric service lateral occasioned by the undergrounding: and/or</li> <li>b. The conversion of a customer's meter panel to accept underground service occasioned by the undergrounding, excluding permit fees.</li> </ul> </li> <li>The utility of the governing body may establish a lesser allowance, or may limit the amount of money to be expended on a single customer's electric service or the total amount to be expended on all electric service installations in a particular project.</li> </ul>
4. Unauthorized work credit trading is not permitted, except for intra-county donations of work credits from a county government to cities and towns within the county or from a city or town to its county government, and pooling of work credits amongst two or more adjoining municipalities for a project with community benefit for the adjoining municipalities.

5. The Utility does not have the discretion to allow communities to borrow work credits

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В. In circumstances other than those covered by A above, the Utility will replace its existing overhead electric facilities with underground electric facilities along public streets and roads or other locations mutually agreed upon when requested by an applicant or applicants when all of the following conditions are met:

from future allocations beyond any 2022 allocation.

- 1. a. All property owners served from the overhead facilities to be removed first agree in writing to have the wiring changes made on their premises so that service may be furnished from the underground distribution system in accordance with the Utility's rules and that the Utility may discontinue its overhead service upon completion of the underground facilities.
  - b. Suitable legislation is in effect requiring such necessary wiring changes to be made and authorizing the Utility to discontinue its overhead service.
