# Subject: Liberty Utilities (CalPeco Electric) LLC (U 933-E) – Language Changes to Liberty CalPeco Preliminary Statement 13.1 GRCMA

# **Purpose**

Pursuant to Decision (D.) 21-12-010, Liberty Utilities (CalPeco Electric) LLC (U 933-E) ("Liberty") hereby submits this **Tier 1** Advice Letter to revise language in its Preliminary Statement 13.1, General Rate Case Memorandum Account ("GRCMA") tariff.

Attachments following the Advice Letter summary include revised versions of the impacted tariff sheets.

## **Discussion**

This Advice Letter updates language in Liberty's Preliminary Statement 13.1. The following changes are being made to the respective tariff pages:

<u>General Rate Case Memorandum Account (GRCMA)</u>. As stated in the Account Disposition section of the GRCMA Preliminary Statement, recovery costs for the shortfall or overcollection of the difference resulting from the difference in general rates effective December 31, 2021 and the final rates authorized by the Commission in Application (A.) 21-05-017.

## **Effective Date**

Liberty requests that this **Tier 1** Advice Letter be effective as of January 1, 2022.

## **Protests**
