**Subject: Liberty's Transportation Electrification Pilot Programs for Schools and Parks –
Tribal Engagement and Participation**

Purpose

Pursuant to Ordering Paragraph ("OP") 21 of Commission Decision ("D.") 19-11-017, and Assembly Bills (AB) 1082 and 1083, Liberty Utilities (CalPeco Electric) LLC (U 933 E) ("Liberty") submits this Tier 1 advice letter to address engagement with tribal communities in the Liberty service territory to participate in the AB 1082 and 1083 pilots.

Background

Prior to program implementation, OP 21 of D.19-11-017 directs parties to file a Tier 1 Advice Letter with the Commission's Energy Division that at a minimum address: (1) how many tribal communities are interested in participating in the pilots; and (2) how many chargers will be deployed in tribal communities in the pilots.

Tribal Community Participation in AB 1082/1083 Pilots

There is one tribal community in Liberty's service area, the Woodfords Community of the Washoe Tribe. D.19-11-017 found that it is reasonable to allow parks that are open to the public and located in tribal lands to participate in the AB 1082 and AB 1083 pilots.¹ This community's public facilities are not open to the public, which makes the facilities ineligible to participate in Liberty's AB 1082 and 1083 Pilots. Liberty CalPeco works closely with the Washoe Tribe and will monitor the needs and opportunities regarding electric vehicle charging for consideration in future Transportation Electrification ("TE") programs.
