Liberty Utilities (Liberty Utilities Electric) LLC (U 933-E) ("Liberty Utilities") hereby submits this Tier 1 Advice Letter to provide advance notice of a planned Major Plant Addition in the 2017 Post Test Year Adjustment Mechanism.

# **Purpose**

The purpose of this Advice Letter is to provide notice of Liberty Utilities intent to revise general rates associated with a planned Major Plant Addition. Liberty Utilities is required to submit such an advice letter and provide such notice prior to seeking any such increase pursuant to the Post-Test Year Adjustment Mechanism ("PTAM") authorized by Decision ("D.") 12-11-030 (A.12-02-014).

# **Background**

In D.12-11-030, the Commission authorized Liberty Utilities to implement the PTAM. The PTAM procedures are detailed in Section 9, Post-Test Year Adjustment Mechanism of the Preliminary Statement. The two components of a PTAM submission set forth in the Preliminary Statement are:

Attrition Rate Factor Component

The attrition rate factor will be based on the current year's September Global Insight U.S. Economic Outlook forecast for the Consumer Price Index, minus a 0.5% productivity factor (but will not be less than zero).

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#### Major Plant Additions Component

For purposes of the PTAM, a "Major Plant Addition" includes any capital project closed to plant-in-service that exceeds \$4 million in a calendar year. The revenue requirement associated with a Major Plant Addition would also include the California portion of the operation and maintenance expenses, depreciation and property taxes. Liberty [Utilities] shall file a Tier 1 advice letter providing notice of a planned Major Plant Addition prior to seeking any PTAM adjustment as described in Section F associated with that Major Plant Addition. (emphasis added)

In D.16-01-021 (Application 15-04-016) ("Luning Approval Decision"), the Commission approved a Settlement Agreement between Liberty Utilities and the Office of Ratepayer Advocates ("ORA") authorizing Liberty Utilities to purchase the Luning Solar Project and to recover in rates its costs associated with the acquisition, financing, ownership, operation and maintenance of the Luning Solar Project.<sup>1</sup> The Settlement Agreement authorizes Liberty Utilities to seek in the PTAM it shall submit in October 2016 rate recovery commencing January 1, 2017 for the following costs associated with the Luning Project:

1. The "costs to acquire and own the Luning Project (a) up to 95% of the Maximum Reasonable Costs Amount into rate base as of January 1, 2017";<sup>2</sup> and

Section 3.3 of the Settlement Agreement initially provided that Liberty Utilities could seek rate recovery for up to 100 percent of the Maximum Reasonable Cost Amount (i.e. the maximum acquisition cost that Liberty Utilities will be allowed to place into ratebase) through its October 2016 PTAM submission. However, in approving the Settlement Agreement, the Commission restricted Liberty Utilities to seeking only 95% of the Maximum Reasonable Cost Amount in the October 2016 PTAM submission. Liberty Utilities is authorized to seek recovery of up to the remaining 5% of the Maximum Reasonable Cost Amount in its October 2017 PTAM submission and have these amounts included in its rate base of as of January 1, 2018.

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2. The "Luning Project Operating Expenses" which Liberty Utilities shall incur in 2017 and 2018 associated with the operation of the Luning Project.<sup>3</sup>

This Advice Letter accordingly provides notice that Liberty Utilities shall be seeking rate recovery in its October 2016 PTAM submission for the capital and operating costs associated with the Luning Project as authorized by the Luning Approval Decision.

Section 3.2 of the Settlement Agreement further provides that to the extent that the Luning Project is not able to achieve commercial operation as of January 1, 2017, "Liberty Utilities shall, in consultation with ORA, submit an additional pleading to propose adjustments in its 2017 rate recovery necessary to account for the post-January 1, 2017 commercial operation date of the Luning Project."

The Luning Project is now contemplated to achieve commercial operation as of February 1, 2017. Liberty Utilities has accordingly notified ORA of this slight deferral of the anticipated commercial operation date for the Luning Project. ORA remains amenable to Liberty Utilities requesting rate recovery for the Luning Project in the October 2016 PTAM submission, provided the ratemaking Liberty Utilities proposes recognizes and makes the adjustments necessary to account for the change in the commercial operation date. ORA further agrees that Liberty Utilities submission of this Tier 1 Advice Letter represents the "additional pleading" the Parties contemplated in Section 3.2 of the Settlement Agreement.

Liberty Utilities shall in its October 2016 PTAM submission provide the most current information regarding the anticipated commercial operation date for the Luning Project.

# **Effective Date:**

Liberty Utilities requests that this Tier 1 Advice Letter be effective as of September 9, 2016.

# **Protests**

Anyone wishing to protest this filing may do so by letter sent via U.S. mail, by facsimile or by email, any of which must be received no later than September 29, 2016, which is 20 days after the date of this filing. The protest shall set forth the grounds upon which it is based and shall be
