This supplemental filing is being made pursuant to Commission Resolution W-4961.

#### Summary

The purpose of this advice letter filing is to request recovery of the costs recorded in Park's Conservation Memorandum Accounts including the following accounts: (1) the California Urban Water Conservation Council Best Management Practice Memorandum Account (2) the Conservation Implementation Costs Memorandum Account and (3) the Conservation Proceeding (I.07-01-022) Memorandum Account. This request is made pursuant to the Commission's direction in Decision 08-02-036, dated February 28, 2008.

On March 13, 2014 the Commission issued Resolution W-4961 authorizing recovery of a surcharge of \$174,643 for costs recorded in Park's various Conservation Memorandum Accounts.

Ordering Paragraph No. 2 of Resolution W-4961 states the following:

"Park Water Company shall, within five days of the effective date of this resolution, supplement Advice Letter No. 238-W, incorporating the revised rate schedules attached

to this resolution as Appendix A, and concurrently cancel its presently effective Schedules No. PR-1-R: Residential metered service; Schedule No. PR-1-NR: Non-Residential metered service; Schedule No. PR-9CM: Construction and other temporary service, and Schedule No. PR-4F: Non-metered fire sprinkler service."

#### Background

On January 11, 2007, the Commission opened an Order Instituting Investigation to consider policies to achieve the Commission's conservation objectives for Class A water utilities, Investigation (I.) 07-01-022 (OII). In the OII, the Commission ordered the consolidation of four pending conservation rate design applications – Application (A.) 06-09-016 (Golden State Water Company), A.06-10-026 (California Water Service Company), A.06-11-009 (Park Water Company), and A.06-11-010 (Suburban Water Systems). Phase 1A of the consolidated proceeding involved contested issues raised by the parties to the settlement agreements and the Suburban Water Systems proposed memorandum account.

Decision (D.) 08-02-036 dated February 28, 2008 constituted an order resolving Phase 1A Settlement Agreements and Contested Issues. The Commission adopted eight settlements involving conservation rates, revenue adjustment mechanisms, modified cost balancing accounts, return on equity adjustment, a low-income assistance program, customer education and outreach, data collection and reporting, and endorsed the parties' efforts to resolve access for customers with disabilities in light of the adoption of conservation rate designs. Specifically, D.08-02-036 adopted three settlement agreements involving Park: (1) the June 15, 2007 Park/DRA settlement agreement on conservation rate design, WRAM and MCBA, (2) the July 30, 2007 Park/DRA settlement agreement on conservation memorandum account, (3) the August 10, 2007 Park/Joint Consumers/Consumer Federation of California settlement agreement on data collection, monitoring and reporting. Additionally, D.08-02-036 authorized Suburban Water Systems and the other Class A water utilities to establish memorandum accounts to track the legal and related costs of participating in the OII. The Decision permitted tracking of costs in these memorandum accounts from the date of the issuance of the OII (January 11, 2007).

The California Urban Water Conservation Council Best Management Practice (CUWCC BMP) Memorandum Account authorized by D.08-03-036 tracks the costs of conservation programs that are consistent with and based upon the Best Management Practices contained in the Memorandum of Understanding adopted by the California Urban Water Conservation Council and in addition to the costs already covered in the authorized rates. Costs were allowed to be booked to the CUWCC BMP Memorandum Account until December 31, 2009 and were not to exceed an aggregate balance of \$200,000. The total balance recorded in the CUWCC BMP memorandum account including interest through December 2012 is an under-collection of \$125,390.

The Conservation Implementation Costs Memorandum Account authorized by D. 08-02-036 tracks the costs associated with implementation of increasing block rates, data collection, and monitoring costs including printing, publishing, and mailing customer notices. The total balance

recorded in the Conservation Implementation Costs Memorandum Account including interest through December 2012 is an under-collection of \$9,322.

D.10-04-001 affirmed D.08-02-036 authorization of a memorandum account to track legal and related expenses incurred in participating in the OII for all Class A water utilities from the date of the issuance of the proceeding. The cost of preparing Park Application 06-11-009 consolidated with I.07-001-022 is excluded from the Conservation Proceeding Memorandum Account. The total balance recorded in the Conservation Proceeding Memorandum Account including interest through December 2012 is an under-collection of \$97,022.

Resolution W-4961 approves Park Advice Letter No. 238-W with the modifications discussed within the Resolution. Park is authorized to recover \$174,643 through monthly surcharges pursuant to Table 3 of the Resolution. Resolution W-4961 further authorizes Park to supplement Advice Letter 238-W by incorporating the revised rate schedules attached to the Resolution as Appendix A.

Park bills on a bi-monthly basis and therefore the service of the customer notice including the 20-day protest period was completed by April 20, 2013.

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission).





The cost of preparing Park Application 06-11-009 consolidated with I.07-001-022 is excluded from the Conservation Proceeding Memorandum Account. The total balance recorded in the Conservation Proceeding Memorandum Account including interest through December 2012 is an under-collection of \$97,022.

Park proposes to combine the balances recorded in the CUWCC BMP Memorandum Account, Conservation Implementation Memorandum Account and the Conservation Proceeding Memorandum Account for a total combined under-collection of \$231,734. The increase in revenues would generate an increase in uncollectible and franchise fee expense of \$3,266, above the amount currently reflected in Park's rates. Park therefore is requesting recovery of a combined total of \$235,000 or 0.80% of its 2012 adopted revenue requirements.

Park proposes to recover the under-collection through a monthly surcharge of \$0.707 per customer applicable to potable service for Schedule No. PR-1-R, residential metered service, Schedule No. PR-1-NR, non-residential metered service, Schedule PR-9CM, construction and other temporary meter service, and Schedule No. PR-4F, non-metered fire sprinkler service. The surcharge will be in effect for a 12-month period. The surcharge is applicable to all customer classes except for reclaimed water service.

The Commission Staff has been provided with workpapers developing the balances in the memorandum accounts and the calculation of the surcharge.

# NON-METERED FIRE SPRINKLER SERVICE (continued)

- 4. Service hereunder is for private fire protection systems to which no connections for other than fire protection purposes are allowed and which are regularly inspected by the underwriters having jurisdiction, are installed according to specifications of the utility, and are maintained to the satisfaction of the utility. The utility may install the standard detector type meter approved by the Board of Fire Underwriters for protection against theft, leakage or waste of water, and the cost paid by the applicant. Such payment shall not be subject to refund.
- 5. The utility undertakes to supply only such water at such pressure as may be available at any time through the normal operation of its system.
- 6. Any unauthorized use of water, other than for fire extinguishing purposes, shall be charged for at the regular established rate as set forth under Schedule No. PR-1-NR, Nonresidential Metered Service, and/or may be the grounds for the immediate disconnection of the sprinkler service without liability to the Company.
- 7. The utility reserves the right to limit the installation of private fire hydrant service to such areas where public fire hydrant does not exist or where public fire hydrant service is limited in scope to the detriment of the applicant.
- 8. A late charge will be imposed per Schedule No. LC.
- 9. All bills are subject to the reimbursement fee set forth on Schedule No. UF.
