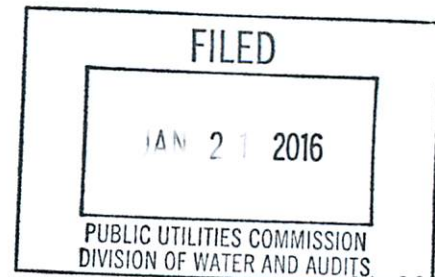

Summary

This supplemental filing is being made to incorporate comments from the Division of Water and Audits ("DWA"). This supplemental filing will replace Advice Letter 263-W in its entirety.

Liberty Park Water is seeking to implement interim rates in its service area and to modify its Preliminary Statement, to add Part X, to reflect the establishment and implementation of the Interim Rates Memorandum Account (IRMA). The purpose of the IRMA is to track the difference between the interim rates and the final rates adopted by the Commission in A.15-01-001. The interim rates are based on the existing rate levels, will be subject to refund, and adjusted upward or downward, consistent with the final rates adopted by the Commission in the pending general rate case. The interim rates and IRMA are requested pursuant to the Administrative Law Judge's (ALJ) Ruling Granting Interim Rates in A.15-01-001, dated October 27, 2015 and Public Utilities Code §455.2. The proposed interim rates generate a revenue increase of \$167,139 or 0.50%.

Background

On January 2, 2015, the Company filed a general rate case application, A.15-01-001 for its service area in accordance with D.07-05-062, the Rate Case Plan.

Public Utilities Code §455.2 provides for interim rate relief when the Commission is unable to issue its final decision on the general rate case application of a water corporation with greater than 10,000 service connections in a manner ensuring the decision becomes effective on the first day of the test year in the application. Public Utilities Code Section 455.2 states the following:

455.2. (a) The Commission shall issue its final decision on a general rate case application of a water corporation with greater than 10,000 service connections in a manner that ensures that the Commission's decision becomes effective on the first day of the first test year in the general rate increase application.

(b) If the Commission's decision is not effective in accordance with subdivision (a), the applicant may file a tariff implementing interim rates that may be increased by an amount equal to the rate of inflation as compared to existing rates. The interim rates shall be effective on the first day of the first test year in the general rate case application. These interim rates shall be subject to refund and shall be adjusted upward or downward back to the interim rate effective date, consistent with the final rates adopted by the Commission. The Commission may authorize a lesser increase in interim rates if the Commission finds the rates to be in the public interest. If the presiding officer in the case determines that the Commission's decision cannot become effective on the first day of the first test year due to actions by the water corporation, the presiding officer or Commission may require a different effective date for the interim rates or final rates.

(c) The Commission shall establish a schedule to require every water corporation subject to the rate case plan for water corporations to file an application pursuant to the plan every three years. The plan shall include a provision to allow the filing requirement to be waived upon mutual agreement of the Commission and the water corporation.

(d) The requirements of subdivisions (a) and (b) may be waived at any time by mutual consent of the executive director of the Commission and the water corporation.

The first day of the test year for Application 15-01-001 is January 1, 2016. The Company filed a motion requesting interim rates on July 13, 2015 because of its belief that a final decision by the Commission would not be timely for new rates to become effective January 1, 2016. On October 27, 2015, ALJ Burcham issued a Ruling granting Interim Rates. In his ruling ALJ Burcham ordered:

IT IS RULED THAT Park Water Company must file with the Commission, by Tier 1 Advice Letter, a tariff implementing interim rates for its service territory and establishing a Memorandum Account to track the difference between the interim rates and the final rates adopted by the Commission in this proceeding pursuant to Pub. Util. Code § 455.2 and Decisions D.04-06-018 and D.07-05-062. The interim rates may become effective January 1, 2016, in the event the Commission is unable to issue a final decision on this Application that would allow for new rates effective January 1, 2016.

This advice letter filing is in response to that ruling.

Request

Liberty Park Water is requesting interim rates for its service area and to establish an Interim Rates Memorandum Account to track the difference between the interim rates and the final rates adopted by the Commission in this proceeding. The revenue increase of \$167,139 or 0.50% is based on the November 2015 U.S. Cities Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

As stated in ALJ Burcham's ruling, the Company shall file with the Commission, by Tier 1 Advice letter, a tariff implementing interim rates for its service territory and a request to establish a Memorandum Account to track the difference between the interim rates and the final rates adopted by the Commission in this proceeding. The interim rates shall become effective no sooner than January 1, 2016.

Revisions to Special Conditions

Additionally, Liberty Park Water proposes to update Schedules PR-1-R, Residential Metered Service, PR-1-NR, Non-Residential Metered Service, PR-4F, Non-Metered Fire Sprinkler Service, and PR-6F, Reclaimed Water Service to remove the surcharges that have expired and are no longer in effect.

Revisions to Preliminary Statement

Liberty Park Water proposes to revise its Preliminary Statement to include Part X, Interim Rates Memorandum Account (IRMA). The purpose of the IRMA is to track the difference between the interim rates and the final rates adopted by the Commission in this proceeding for the 2016-2018 rate case cycle. Additionally, Park proposes to delete Part Q of the Preliminary Statement, the Interim Rates Memorandum Account, established for the 2013-2015 rate case cycle which has been terminated.

Tier Designation

Pursuant to the ALJ's ruling, this advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation.

Requested Effective Date

Pursuant to ALJ Burcham's ruling, and General Order 96-B, General Rule 7.3.1, Liberty Park Water requests this filing become effective on January 1, 2016.

Notice and Service

In accordance with General Order 96-B, General Rules 4.3 and 7.2 and Water Industry Rule 4.1, a copy of this advice letter will be mailed or electronically transmitted on January 21, 2016 to competing and adjacent utilities and other utilities or interested parties having requested such notification.

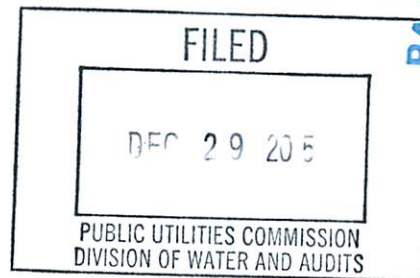
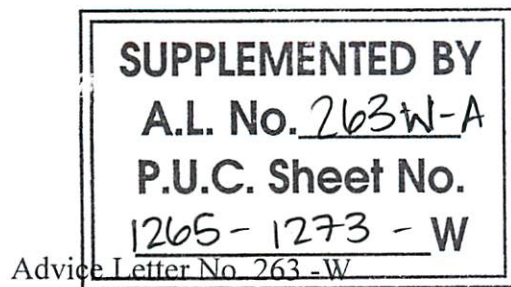

The difference in service charge revenue determined by the recorded number of customers multiplied by the difference between the service charge rates based on the current authorized Cost of Capital and the service charge rates resulting from the Cost of Capital increase authorized by the Commission at a future date.
- b. The difference in commodity rate revenue determined by the recorded water sales multiplied by the difference between the commodity rates based on the current authorized Cost of Capital and the commodity rates resulting from Cost of Capital increase authorized by the Commission at a future date.
