## **TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA**

Liberty Utilities (Park Water) Corp. (U 314-W) (“Liberty Park Water”) hereby transmits the attached revised tariff sheets applicable to water service in its service territory.

### **Summary**

This request is made pursuant to Ordering Paragraph No. 6 of D.23-02-003, dated February 2, 2023. The purpose of this advice letter is to recover the difference between the interim rates established by Advice Letters 325-W, effective July 1, 2022 and 328-W, effective September 12, 2022, and the final rates authorized by Advice Letter 331-W-A, effective April 7, 2023, in compliance with D.23-02-003.

### **Background and Discussion**

#### **Test Year 2022 General Rate Case (“GRC”) Proceeding**

On July 2, 2021, Liberty Park Water and Liberty Utilities (Apple Valley Ranchos Water) Corp. (“Liberty Apple Valley”), together as Liberty, filed GRC applications (A.21-07-004 and A.21-07-003 respectively) with a Test Year effective date of July 1, 2022. Both applications requested authority to consolidate the proceedings. On September 1, 2021, the assigned Administrative Law Judge (“ALJ”) issued ruling consolidating the proceedings. A prehearing conference was held on September 16, 2021. On September 30, 2021, the assigned Commissioner issued a Scoping Memo and Ruling setting forth the scope of issues, need for hearing, schedule, and category. On January 14, 2022, Liberty filed its amended applications as granted by the assigned ALJ. The public participation hearings were held on March 8 and March 9, 2022 for Liberty Apple Valley and Liberty Park Water respectively. Evidentiary hearings were held virtually from March 21 through March 23, 2022. On May 27, 2022, the assigned ALJ issued ruling granting interim rates equal to the rates then currently in effect and establishment of memorandum accounts to track the difference between interim rates and the final authorized rates. Liberty and Cal Advocates filed Opening and Reply Briefs on May 12 and May 25, 2022 respectively. On February 2, 2023, the Commission issued D.23-02-003 authorizing 2022 revenue requirements for Liberty Park Water and Liberty Apple Valley.

#### **Interim Rates Memorandum Account (“IRMA”)**

Pursuant to D.23-02-003, Liberty Park Water filed Advice Letter 331-W-A, implementing the final authorized rates for 2022. The advice letter was approved by the Commission with an effective date of April 7, 2023.

Ordering Paragraph No. 6 of D.23.02.003 states the following:

6. Within 120 days of the issuance of this decision, Liberty Utilities (Apple Valley Ranchos Water) Corp. and Liberty Utilities (Park Water) Corp. shall submit Tier 1 advice letters to compare the difference between interim rates and approved rates. The difference between interim rates and final rates adopted here, shall be recovered in accordance with Standard Practice U-27-W.

Liberty Park Water has determined the under-collection recorded in the IRMA for the period of July 1, 2022 through April 30, 2023. The net total under-collected revenue of \$2,114,233 is calculated using recorded bill and usage consumption as well as adopted and recorded usage revenue for that period.

Effective July 1, 2022, the credit card fees were embedded in rates. As such, the credit card fees collected from customers for the period of July 1, 2022 through March 20, 2023, totaling \$97,721 (over-collection), are to be refunded to customers.

With interest through April 30, 2023 including the over-collected credit card fees, Liberty Park Water requests to recover a net shortfall of \$2,063,103 or 5.12% of its 2022 authorized revenue requirement.

Liberty Park Water proposes a 24-month surcharge of \$0.233 per Ccf for Schedule No. PR-1-R, Residential Metered Service, Schedule No. PR-1-NR, Non-Residential Metered Service, Schedule No. PR-4F, Non-Metered Fire Sprinkler Service, and Schedule No. PR-6, Reclaimed Water Service.

The Commission Staff has been provided with workpapers showing the development of the under-collected revenue and interest calculations recorded in the IRMA. The calculation of the surcharge is included in the workpapers.

### **Tier Designation**

Pursuant to Ordering Paragraph No. 6 of D.23-02-003, this advice letter is submitted with Tier 1 destination.

### **Requested Effective Date**

Pursuant to General Rule 7.3.2 of General Order 96-B, Liberty Park Water requests this filing become effective July 1, 2023.

### **Notice and Service**

In accordance with General Order 96-B, General Rules 4.3 and 7.2 and Water Industry Rule 4.1, a copy of this advice letter will be mailed or electronically transmitted on June 1, 2023 to competing and adjacent utilities and other utilities or interested parties having requested such notification.

Customer notification of this rate increase was previously accomplished in A.21-07-003, et al. as required by Rule No. 3.2 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure. Additional public notice of this filing is not required.

**Response or Protest**

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission).

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Commission's Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:

5. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$ 0.543 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 18 months, beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter 289-W. This surcharge will recover the under-collection in the WRAM and MCBA as of December 31, 2018.
6. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$0.120 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 12 months, beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter 309-W. This surcharge will recover the under collection in the Consolidated Expense Balancing Account as of December 31, 2020.
7. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$2.63 surcredit per customer is to be added to the Customer's bill for a period of 12 months, beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter 309-W. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$0.126 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 16 months, beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter 310-W. This surcharge will recover the under collection in the Interim Rates Memorandum Account as of November 19, 2020.
10. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$0.128 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 18 months, beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter 313-W. **NON-METERED FIRE SPRINKLER SERVICE**

4. Service hereunder is for private fire protection systems to which no connections for other than fire protection purposes are allowed and which are regularly inspected by the underwriters having jurisdiction, are installed according to specifications of the utility, and are maintained to the satisfaction of the utility. The utility may install the standard detector type meter approved by the Board of Fire Underwriters for protection against theft, leakage or waste of water, and the cost paid by the applicant. Such payment shall not be subject to refund.
5. The utility undertakes to supply only such water at such pressure as may be available at any time through the normal operation of its system.
6. Any unauthorized use of water, other than for fire extinguishing purposes, shall be charged for at the regular established rate as set forth under Schedule No. PR-1-NR, Nonresidential Metered Service including Special Condition No. 21, and/or may be the grounds for the immediate disconnection of the sprinkler service without liability to the Company.
7. The utility reserves the right to limit the installation of private fire hydrant service to such areas where public fire hydrant does not exist or where public fire hydrant service is limited in scope to the detriment of the applicant.
8. A late charge will be imposed per Schedule No. LC.
9. All bills are subject to the reimbursement fee set forth on Schedule No. UF.
10. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$0.120 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 12 months, beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter 309-W. This surcharge will recover the under collection in the Consolidated Expense Balancing as of December 31, 2020.
11. As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$2.63 surcredit per customer is to be added to the Customer's bill for a period of 12 months, beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter 309-W. This surcredit will refund the over collection in the Conservation Expense One-Way Balancing Account and the Tangible Property Regulations Consequences Memorandum as of December 31, 2018.

As authorized by the California Public Utilities Commission, an amount of \$0.233 per Ccf is to be added to the quantity rate for a period of 24 months, beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter 336-W. This surcharge will recover the under-collection in the Interim Rates Memorandum Account as of April 30, 2023.
