But, just like roads and bridges, water infrastructure must be maintained regularly and replaced on a responsible schedule to ensure it will continue operating properly.

The consequences of deferring maintenance is high – as neglected water infrastructure can impact the reliability of service, endanger public health and lead to unplanned disruptions from line breaks, which can damage roads, homes and businesses, and ultimately cost much more than planned replacements.

Liberty Utilities invests in infrastructure and maintains our system to protect water quality and ensure we can continue delivering safe water to customers for generations to come. State regulators also verify that every investment we make is, in fact, needed.

Here are some of our upcoming system improvement projects:

- Replacing more than 4,000 feet of aging steel pipe on Riverside Dr. and Symeron Rd.
- Installing transmission main to supply more reliable water service on outer Hwy. 18 and adjacent neighborhood.
- Installing pressure reducing station and main line connecting two dead-ends for better water reliability and fire protection at the intersection of Apple Valley Rd. and Bear Valley Rd.
- Replacing more than 2,000 feet of undersized pipe on Rincon Rd. to improve water flow.
- Replacing more than 3,000 feet of aging steel pipe on Symeron and Atnah Roads.
